Geography

Summer 2:

We will continue to follow the theme of castles as we learn about maps and keys.

Mathematics

Number and Place value - Understand place value in 2 digit numbers and identify 10s and 1s.

Addition and Subtraction - Add three small numbers, spotting pairs to 10 and doubles. Add and subtract 10 to and from 2 digit numbers.

Fractions, ratio and proportion - Recognise halves and quarters of shapes and begin to know that $2/2=1$, $4/4=1$ and $2/4=1/2$

Measurement - Compare weights and capacities using direct comparison. Measure weight and capacity using uniform non-standard units.

Statistics- Complete tables and block graphs, recording results and information.

Measurement- Recognise, name and know value of coins 1p-£2 and £5 and £10 notes. Solve repeated addition problems using coins, make equivalent amounts using coins.

Art

We will be using a range of different media, including collage and charcoal rubbings, to create pictures of castles, knights and dragons. We will be using paper mache to make a knight's helmet.

Science

The children will be learning all about plants, naming parts of a plant and finding out by investigation what plants need to grow. In the second half of the term our focus will be on plants that we eat and where our food comes from.

ICT

The children will learn how to use a simple animation program to create their own game.

After half term we will be looking at stop-frame animation.

English

During the first part of term we will be reading and watching stories about knights and dragons. The children will complete activities related to the stories including role play, writing character descriptions, newspaper reports and letters.

After half term our focus will be on non-fiction texts. The children will learn more about the layout of non-fiction books and research and write their own fact files about plants and animals. We will also be reading countryside poems written by Michael Morpurgo.

Spelling, punctuation and grammar remains of great importance and will be developed within our English lessons.

Reading skills will continue to be developed within guided reading and individual reading opportunities.
